Dear St. Peter's,

Summer always brings with it many transitions--some permanent, some lasting only a few weeks. We certainly are having our share of transitions at St. Peter's, all of which (I believe) are evidence of the work of the Holy Spirit in our midst. Andrew and Julie are beginning their new life in California, Hannah Hooker is returning to St. Peter's as our intern for the summer, Jerusalem Greer will be joining the St. Peter's staff as our new Minister to Youth, Children, and Families, and I will be spending almost three weeks at Sewanee as I begin a Masters in Sacred Theology. I want to let you know a little about each of these last three.

As many of you know, Hannah Hooker is our seminarian who has just finished her first year at Virginia Theological Seminary in Alexandria, Virginia. Hannah has been a part of our St. Peter's community for several years--first as a student at Hendrix who worked with our College Dinners, then as a youth minister (2011-2012), and most importantly as a member active in the day to day life of St. Peter's (as a Eucharistic Minister, Eucharistic Visitor, pastoral care team member, and ministry team member). Hannah will spend two to three days each week with us this summer. She plans to lead a bible study, participate in pastoral care, and be part of our worship on Sundays. We look forward to her sharing her call to ministry with us!

Jerusalem Greer will be starting as our Minister to Youth, Children, and Families on July 1st. Jerusalem comes to us with many talents and much experience. She is the author of *A Homemade Year: The Blessings of Cooking, Crafting and Coming Together*, which explores bringing the celebration of the liturgical calendar into the home; she is currently under contract to write *Homespun Faith: The Gentle Fraying of an Ordinary Life*, which will focus on exploring ancient spiritual practices in the home. Jerusalem is a retreat leader, has written Christian Education curricula for children and youth, and currently oversees family programming for grades K-8 at eStem Public Charter School in Little Rock. We cannot wait to welcome Jerusalem, her husband Nathan, and their sons Wiley and Miles into our St. Peter's community.

And, finally, I will be beginning a Masters of Sacred Theology at Sewanee this summer. The degree will involve three weeks of study on the campus of the University of the South each summer for the next several years, as well as the writing of a thesis. As reading, studying, and discussing theology is very much a spiritual practice for me, one that feeds my soul, I'm thankful to the Vestry of St. Peter's for this opportunity and for their understanding. I think the things I learn will be beneficial to my preaching and ministry at St. Peter's in many ways. I will be in Sewanee this year from June 9th until June 28th. The Rev. Hap Hoffman is a wonderful retired priest from Little Rock, and he will be with us on June 15th and June 22nd.

I know summer is a busy time for everyone, as well as a time for fellowship, sabbath, and catching up. We hope to see you when you're in town!

Sunday Morning Adult Christian Education

8:45 am - Early Christianity: The Experience of the Divine (Library)

Early Christianity is viewed as it appears in the New Testament and other early literature. The emphasis is upon religious experience, and what accounts for its continuing strength in what is called a "Post Christian World." What were the forces driving the phenomenal growth of Christianity in the first century? How did religious experience take on new forms as Christianity developed during the next three centuries? A video lecture series presented by Professor Luke Johnson of Emory University is used as the source of discussion for this series.

9:50 am Adult Forum (Library)

Jane Harris will lead discussions based upon the book *Roadside Religion: In Search of the Sacred, the Strange, and the Substance of Faith*, by Timothy Beal. Beal and his family have traveled the two-lane highways of America and discovered some most unusual expressions of American religious experiences, including Holy Land U. S. A. in Bedford County, Virginia; the Holy Land Experience in Orlando, Florida; the Cross Garden in Prattville, Alabama; the World's Largest Ten Commandments in Murphy, North Carolina; and the Precious Moments Inspiration Park in Carthage, Missouri. We will discuss these attempts by Americans to create sacred space and to tell the story of their own personal spiritual lives in some imaginative and strange ways, which nonetheless give expressions to their faith in God and their desire to share with others their stories.

GUATEMALA MEDICAL MISSION


On April 26th, an enthusiastic group of 21 people left for the Guatemala. In the one week that we were there, we treated over 400 patients and worked on construction projects in 2 churches. Each year that we return, we are seeing some of the same children grow healthier. The hospitality and gratitude of our brothers and sisters in the Western Region of the Diocese of Guatemala is boundless. We were fed, we were prayed over, and we felt the love of our hosts.

During the week that we were gone, the devastating tornadoes struck in Mayflower and Vilonia. Thankfully, we were quickly aware that all of our families and homes had survived. That being said, it was confusing and hard to be so far away from you in that time. We found solace in our work and in the words of Bishop Lainfiesta, who reminded us of God's infinite wisdom and knowledge in the face of all things. It was immensely comforting to hear from Teri as well. The very next day, the Guatemalan newspapers were covering the events and many people expressed their sympathies and love for us and our homes.

We took a record number of supplies, clothing, shoes and eyeglasses with us to Guatemala – nearly 40 suitcases weighing 50 lbs each. It was such fun to be able to give care to both the body and the soul in the form of medicine and clothes. A sewing group from Salem UMC, here in Conway had donated a large number of little girl's handmade dresses. What a wonderful gift!



Vestry Summary

April 27, 2014

Attendees: Douglas Young, Kelley King, Sylvia Walker, Liz Larson, John Shute, Kitson Roger, Scotty Bell, Jeanetta Darley, Teri Daily.

Opening Prayer: Teri Daily

Approval of minutes from last meeting: Warren made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Motion seconded and all approved.

Committee and Ministry Reports:

1. **Food Pantry:** Sylvia Walker. The pantry served 164 families in April, 21 new families.
2. **Finance Committee:** John Shute. Financial reports were distributed and reviewed. Scotty made a motion to accept financials as presented, seconded by Jay and all approved.

Old/Continuing Business Items:

1. **The Elizabeth Pope Library dedication on Mother's Day:** The plaque is on its way. The dedication will take place after the 11:00 service.
2. **Mother's Day Reception: Men of the Vestry** Mimosas will be served and carnations distributed to women after the services.
3. **Courtyard Labyrinth Update:** A Saturday morning workshop will hopefully be held in the future to explore how labyrinths can be used as spiritual tools. The vestry feels this is a good time to improve the courtyard. Teri suggested having a landscape artist come and give us some guidance.
4. **New Minister to Youth, Children and Families: Jerusalem Greer** Jerusalem will start on July 1st. Three candidates were ultimately brought in before the decision was made to hire Jerusalem. Each candidate met with the staff, the youth and with the search committee. Salary and package items discussed and voted on.

New Business

1. **Good-bye for Andrew, Julie and Oliver. Last Sunday is May 18th. Picnic to say goodbye will be Wednesday, May 21st. Discussion of gift.** Dee will be organizing the picnic. The Vestry discussed a gift for the family. Decision made to give them a picture of St. Peter's.
2. **Community Garden:** Three new beds are complete and ready to go. No fee to use a bed, the church just asks that farmers give part of what they grow to the food pantry. Sylvia remarked that there isn't water readily available where the beds are, but hoses can be used. The needed dirt costs about \$200.00.
3. **Kitchen:** The stove and refrigerator need to be replaced or made functional. Sylvia drew up a plan for the back kitchen renovation. The Vestry discussed Sylvia's drawings: what works, what doesn't and how to go forward. Scotty said he'd touch base with Ric and Randy to look at the drawings and discuss feasibility.

Rector's Report: Teri Daily

1. **Coverage for June:** Teri will be gone the 15th and the 22nd in June. She has emergency coverage for that three week period: Jos Tharakan will be covering for her. The challenge is finding supply priests for both of those Sundays.
2. **Cares and Concerns Committee:** Teri will make some calls to ask folks to join.
3. **Practicing the way of Jesus:** The book study has started and will run for the next five weeks. This group is discerning whether we want to offer further group experiences to explore specific practices that exemplify the way of Jesus.
4. **Holy Week:** It was a lovely week!
5. **Morgan House:** Curtains are going up. Two 6-foot pews will be moved over to the Morgan House, and will be taken from up in the balcony. We will probably call a moving company to handle moving the pews. Sylvia asked about the old altar railings in the parish hall, which are falling apart. Teri suggested offering them to whomever has an attachment to them.
6. **Vestry Retreat in September:** Next month a date will be decided for the retreat. Warren suggested that we all email Teri with available dates. Teri suggested that we all read William Countryman's book "Living on the Border of the Holy" to discuss at the retreat.
7. **Parochial Report:** This portion of the report documents membership, attendance and other services. Douglas moved that we accept the parochial report as presented. Warren seconded the motion and all approved.
