Dear St. Peter's,

It's not unusual these days to see WWJD on bracelets or to hear this acronym uttered casually when one is trying to determine an appropriate course of action. The letters stand for the question: What Would Jesus Do? Although the phrase has become catchy and commercialized in today's culture, it's really the same question that lingers in the mind of all Christians: What does it look like to follow Jesus?

This spring at St. Peter's, a group of people read the book *Practicing the Way of Jesus* by Mark Scandrette, a leader in the church movement in San Francisco called ReImagine: A Center for Integral Christian Practice. The book explains how the people of ReImagine search together for an answer to this question: What would it look like to take Jesus' words seriously and to shape our lives by them in our own time and place?

In *Practicing the Way of Jesus*, Mark Scandrette recounts how the people of ReImagine undertake "experiments in the way of Jesus," forming small groups that develop practices to embody specific words of wisdom that Jesus gives to his followers in the gospels. For example, a group might form to explore what it looks like to live out Jesus' command to "Love your enemies" in twenty-first century Conway, Arkansas. The "experiment" might last four weeks, or six weeks, or only a day.

In the coming months you'll be hearing of various opportunities to sign up for such experiments at St. Peter's. It's a wonderful chance to reflect on the relevance of Jesus' teachings for our own lives today. The first such "experiment" will begin on September 23rd, will continue for six weeks, and will be facilitated by Kent Dunson and myself. All are welcome to participate. Here is the information:

*For many of us, it is easy to forget about our spiritual journey when it isn't Sunday morning. This group, based on Mark Scandrette's book *Practicing the Way of Jesus: Life Together in the Kingdom of Love*, is designed as a challenge that asks us to reexamine daily what it means to live like Jesus. 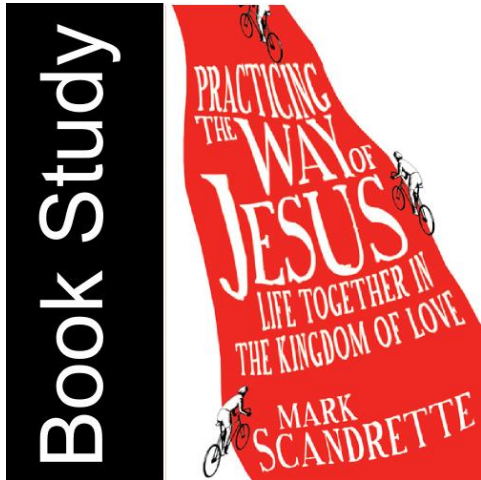


A Commitment to Universal Peace

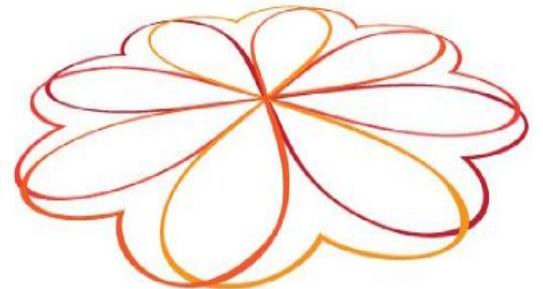

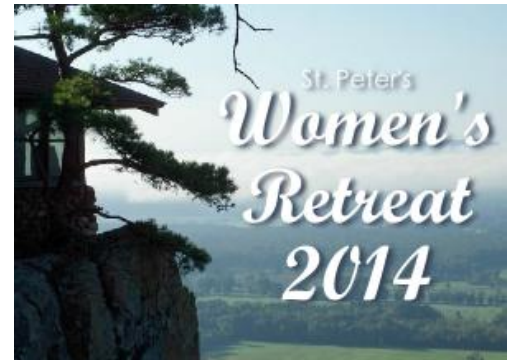
Guatemala Mission Trip 2015

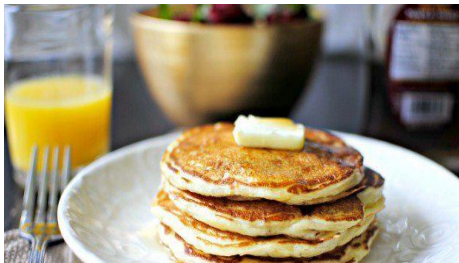
St. Peter's Women's Retreat 2014: Relax, Rejoice, Rejuvenate

We had a lot of generous food donations at the beginning of the year from different businesses in the community who held food drives fundraisers. We are so thankful for those donations because they have helped the food pantry provide meals for hundreds of families in Faulkner County. I am hopeful that those same businesses will keep our food pantry in mind if they put together future food drives. But with the busy summer months behind us, those food donations have been depleted.

We continue to receive food from the Rice Depot once a month at no cost to the food pantry. And I am able to use the donations given through Conway Locally Grown to order eggs, vegetables and laundry soap each week at no cost to the pantry. But the majority of items given out in the staples bags each week is purchased from Price Cutter and the Arkansas Food Bank. Although we are able to get fairly low prices on many of the items we order, there is still a cost associated with it. Please keep the food pantry and the families who need us in mind each week when you go grocery shopping. Your generous monetary donations and food donations are what allow us to continue to feed these families in need.

Here's an easy way to help out the pantry. We all win with this one – the food pantry collects money to purchase more food for the families who need it and you get to eat all the pancakes you want!!! The annual pancake fundraiser at Stoby's will be Sunday, September 28th. Be sure to put that in your calendar so you can stop by and have breakfast before or after one of the services here at St. Peter's. As always, we will need volunteers to make this event successful. So put on your chef's hat or your best smile and come out and help put food on the table of someone who needs it most!

I want to say thank you to all of you who came out for the ministry fair on August 24th. I hope you all found a place to volunteer or to connect with others in the church. A special thank you goes out to those who signed up to volunteer with the food pantry. Without your help, none of this would be possible.
