Dear St. Peter's,

"To be grateful is to recognize the love of God in everything He has given us – and He has given us everything. Every breath we draw is a gift of His love, every moment of existence is a grace, for it brings with it immense graces from Him. Gratitude therefore takes nothing for granted, is never unresponsive, is constantly awakening to new wonder and to praise of the goodness of God. For the grateful person knows that God is good, not by hearsay but by experience. And that is what makes all the difference."

Busyness is the new normal for most Americans these days. We go from work to running errands to either fixing or grabbing dinner out to doing household chores to maybe an hour of TV before crashing into bed—the whole time checking our emails and Facebook accounts lest we miss something important or merely entertaining. Is such a schedule necessary? For some of us maybe it is. But I also wonder if busyness hasn't become a habit. I, for one, barely think before responding to the question "How are things?" with the one word "Busy."

Busyness isn't bad in and of itself, but it often produces tunnel vision; we fail to notice so much of the world around us, so many opportunities for joy, so many reasons to give God thanks. But there is one way in particular to slow ourselves down, and that's by intentionally practicing gratitude. To be thankful for even the smallest parts of life we've been given requires being present in the moment; it requires watchfulness and attention; it requires *not* just placing our lives on autopilot, but intentionally stopping for moments along the way.

As we prepare for Thanksgiving and also for Advent, a season in which we celebrate a waiting which requires patience, maybe this is the perfect time to cultivate some gratitude in our lives. How do we do that? Brother David Vryhof of the Society of Saint John the Evangelist offers the following suggestions:¹

- By deepening our awareness of the beauty and grace already present in our daily lives.
- By noticing acts of kindness and compassion.
- By leaving judgment to God.
- By keeping alive our sense of wonder at the world and its inhabitants.
- By looking for signs of God's presence and activity in our own lives and in the lives of others.
- By recalling what we owe others.
- By listening, watching, expectantly.
- By praying the "General Thanksgiving" every day (Book of Common Prayer, p.101).

Why not consider beginning to cultivate a life of gratitude this month? What we have to gain is a sense of joy in our lives, a trust in God's faithfulness and provision, and a re-enchantment of the world around us.

8:45 am Early Christianity: The Experience of the Divine (Library)

Early Christianity is viewed as it appears in the New Testament and other early literature. The emphasis is upon religious experience, and what accounts for its continuing strength in what is called a "Post Christian World." What were the forces driving the phenomenal growth of Christianity in the first century? How did religious experience take on new forms as Christianity developed during the next three centuries? A video lecture series presented by Professor Luke Johnson of Emory University is used as the source of discussion for this series.

10 am Family Formation

Family Formation is a multi-generational spiritual formation experience for families with children ages 3-18. 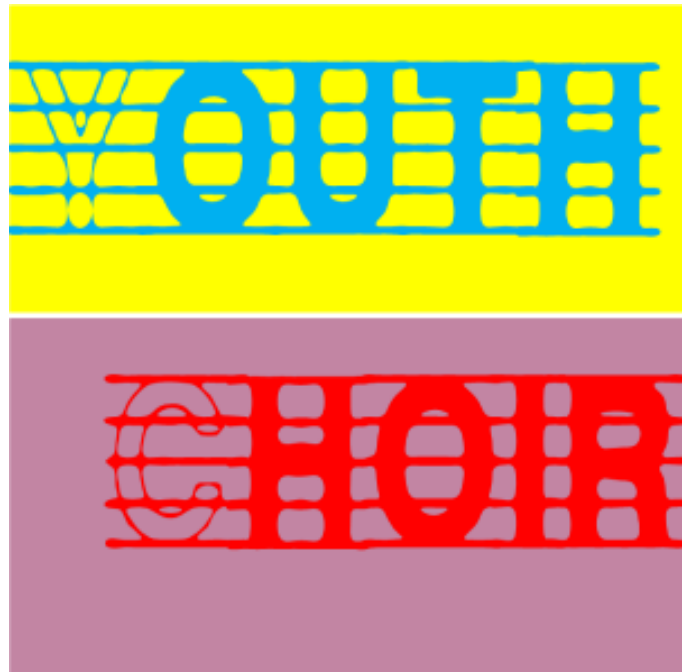

The food pantry has had some great fundraisers this year and lots of big food donations from businesses around the community. Those things have carried us through the year and we are extremely thankful to everyone who has given to the food pantry and allowed us to provide for those in need. With the year winding down and the funds dwindling due to the increased need of those in the community, it is time to talk numbers. The food pantry currently has around \$4,000 in its account. That may seem like a lot of money, but when we are spending \$1,000 per month purchasing food from the Arkansas Food Bank as well as another \$1,000 per month purchasing food from Price Cutter, that \$4,000 will be spent before the end of the year. St. Peter's has been discussing stewardship and the importance of giving for the past few weeks now. I ask all of you to look at the things God is leading you to do. Is He leading you to volunteer your time with the pantry? Is He leading you to donate food or money in order to allow us to continue to put food on the tables of those who may not be able to eat otherwise? Whatever it is that He is calling you to do, I pray that you will follow His lead.

St. Peter's food pantry is a blessing to so many in our community and it is because of all of you. Without the dedication of our volunteers and the generous donations we receive, we would not be able to provide for those who need us most. Thank you for your continued support!

September 7, 2014**

Approval of Minutes from Last Meeting: Jerry Adams made a motion that we accept minutes. Motion was accepted and all approved.

Committee and Ministry Reports

- 1. Finance Committee:** John Shute. Reports distributed. There's been some tightening of income over the summer. Non-pledged income is lower than last year. Capital Campaign officially ends December 2015 and is in the budget through December 2015. Accounting Review is finished. Debbie Turner performed a review rather than a full audit (in keeping with diocesan

guidelines) and will present her findings to the Finance Committee toward the end of September 2014.

- Youth Children and Family Ministry:** Jerusalem Greer. Eight families (25 individuals) attended the first Family Formation Class. We also have eight pre-kindergarten kids. EYC starts Wednesday, September 10. There is a new TV cart which will stay in the parish hall. Locally Grown will be asked to empty the area in the foyer in the Parish Hall in order for us to store the chairs and table cart there.

Jerusalem suggested we use the former nursery room that opens into the courtyard as the EYC room, which would then free the old EYC room for some other use. The first nursery room (which opens into the hall) is enough space legally at this time to accommodate the number of infants currently at St. Peter's. She also suggested we clarify the nursery age requirements in the church newsletter, and we need to consider hiring a new nursery worker for infants. Salary commensurate with experience. Hall, north classrooms, and nursery have been repainted and the ceiling repaired in the old nursery room.

Old/Continuing Business Items

- Stewardship:** Walk in the Way. The Vestry is on the Stewardship Committee. The campaign will begin on October 5 and continue through November 9. Letter to congregation to go out September 22, 2014.
- Courtyard:** Carolyn Scott and committee hired Alan Ostner for \$350.00 to create a landscaping plan for the courtyard with estimated costs of plants and labor. He will incorporate existing plants into new plan and will provide a plan that can be done in stages.
- Kitchen:** Sylvia Walker said the kitchen was finished. Groups using the kitchen will need to keep it clean.
- Ministry Fair:** Well attended. Jerusalem said the youth would take the first Sunday of each month starting October 5 as a Youth Ministry Team.
- Vestry Retreat:** October 3 and 4. Some items to be discussed will be the Morgan House, current facilities, and the book *Living on the Border of the Holy*.
- Women's Retreat:** September 19 – 21, 2014, Camp Mitchell
- St. Peter's Food Pantry Pancake Breakfast:** Stoby's, September 28, 2014.

New Business
