Rev. Teri Daily's Letter

April 2015

Dear St. Peter's Church Family,

As I write these words, many Arkansans are embroiled in the fight against House Bill 1228—a bill that would make it legal to discriminate against gay, lesbian, and transgender people if that discrimination were based on religious conviction. As I write these words, we are also making our way through Holy Week—toward the cross and resurrection. Given this time in which we find ourselves, it seems fitting that the feast days of both Martin Luther King, Jr. and Dietrich Bonhoeffer are on the horizon.

April 4th is a day we remember Martin Luther King, Jr. (an alternate day of remembrance being January 15th). King was born on January 15, 1929 in Atlanta, Georgia, where he witnessed firsthand the injustices faced by Black Americans. Founding the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Martin brought racial prejudice into the consciousness of this country through non-violent mass demonstrations. It was not a calling without risk, a fact made obvious through the many death threats, imprisonments, and physically dangerous experiences that became a part of King's life. In 1957, he was awakened late one night by a threatening telephone call. Alone in his kitchen with a cup of coffee in hand, weeping and praying, he heard the voice of God saying "Martin Luther, stand up for righteousness. Stand up for justice. Stand up for truth. And lo, I will be with you, even until the end of the world." On April 4, 1968, Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated in Memphis where he had traveled to support the right of local sanitation workers.

On April 9th, we celebrate the life of Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Born February 4, 1906, Bonhoeffer became a leader in the 1930s in the Confessing Church, a Protestant force of Nazi resistance. Refusing to seek refuge in the United States until the war's end, Bonhoeffer continued his work in Germany. After being linked to a plot to take Hitler's life, he was arrested in April 1944 and taken to Buchenwald concentration camp and then to Schoenberg Prison. As he was ending a worship service on Sunday, April 8, 1945, two men came to take him away. Bonhoeffer said to a fellow prisoner: "This is the end. For me, the beginning of life." Dietrich Bonhoeffer was hanged on April 9, 1945.

The fate of Martin Luther King, Jr. and Dietrich Bonhoeffer shouldn't surprise us all that much—especially as we make our way through Holy Week. For we all know what a life of faithfulness meant for Jesus when he reached Jerusalem. Yes, discipleship is not cheap, as King and Bonhoeffer remind us. But God is with us every step of the way, and we find hope in what awaits us on Easter Day.

As we look around at our world today, there are many places that the gospel has yet to be made real in our world, many paths that call to us. May the story of Easter – the story of a life and love stronger than even death, the story of new life that springs up in the most hopeless of places – strengthen us and give us courage to live into the promises made at our baptism.

Whereas Jesus instructs his disciples to "love your neighbor as yourself"; and,

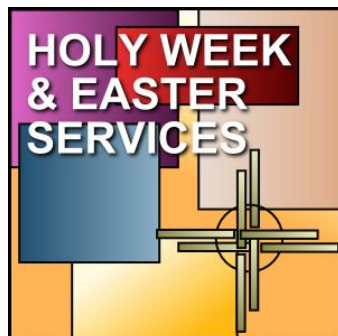
Whereas the Episcopal Church respects the dignity of every human being; and,

Whereas the Rt. Rev. Larry Benfield, Bishop of the Diocese of Arkansas has voiced his opposition to cloaking the desire to discriminate in the language of religion,

BE IT RESOLVED that the 143rd Convention of the Diocese of Arkansas supports the Rt. Rev. Larry Benfield in his position and declares its opposition to Arkansas House Bill 1228, allowing discrimination against gay, lesbian, and transgender people if that discrimination is based on religious conviction; and against Senate Bill 202, barring localities from passing anti-discrimination laws.

The Class will study How Jesus Became God consisting of 24 video lectures by Bart Ehrman, Distinguished Professor of New Testament at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, followed by discussion. "The entire story of how Jesus became God is of paramount importance to everyone with the slightest interest in religion or history. If Jesus had not been declared God at his resurrection, his followers would have remained a small sect within Judaism whose leader ended up on the wrong side of the law & was crucified for his efforts. The massive conversion of Gentiles to belief in Christ would have never happened. Centuries

later, the Roman emperor would never have been converted. The Roman Empire would have never adopted Christian beliefs and ways. The Middle Ages, the Renaissance, the Reformation, and modernity as we know it would have never transpired. And most of us would still be pagan. It is for this reason that there are indeed few questions in the entire history of civilization as important as this one. How did Jesus become God?"
