# Rev. Teri Daily's Letter



April 2016

Dear St. Peter's,

When our son Wilson was young, he was often the cause of a backlog at the communion rail. He would stretch out his hands for the wafer, and hold it ready—waiting to dip it in the chalice of wine when the Eucharistic Minister found her or his way to Wilson. But his was never a quick dip of the wafer in the wine. See, Wilson loved the taste of the wine. So he would submerge the wafer into the wine as much as possible (without his fingers going all the way in), and then he would hold it there, letting the wafer soak up every bit of wine possible until it was totally saturated. Based on the duration of Wilson's intinction, it took, on average, five seconds for the concentration of wine in the wafer to reach its peak.

In a similar vein of time estimates, a reading speed timer calculated that it would take me twenty-eight hours and fifty-five minutes to read Tolstoy's *War and Peace*, people commonly say it takes a minimum of twenty-one days to establish a new habit, and according to Good Housekeeping it takes twelve minutes to boil an egg. And the Church declares it takes fifty days to celebrate Easter.

Easter is not a single day; it is a season of fifty days. Easter begins at sundown on Easter eve, and extends through sundown on the Day of Pentecost. During the season of Easter, the great preachers of the fourth century such as Ambrose and Cyril preached on the meaning of the sacraments to those who were newly baptized. Even now, during this season we focus on the mysteries of our faith and on what a new life lived in resurrection faith might look like.

Just as Wilson would wait patiently for the wine to soak into every bit of the bread, perhaps it takes an entire fifty-day period for resurrection to seep into every aspect of our life. Maybe we have to live with resurrection front and center on our minds and in our hearts in order for us to reflect on how resurrection might affect every corner of our world—our relationship with nature, our responsibility to those with whom we work and play and live, the desire for wholeness that rises up within us, the freedom we forfeit to worry or substances or shame. In fact, fifty days seems a short time to learn the possibilities that Easter brings.

So although the Easter baskets may have been returned to the closet and the candy already eaten, please don't relegate the celebration of Easter to the past. We still have forty-five more days to go. Bask in the resurrection, live in mystery, shout alleluia, reflect on the ever-present promise of resurrection—until we arrive at Pentecost with our hearts even more open to the work of the Holy Spirit, even more ready to share that resurrection with the world around us.

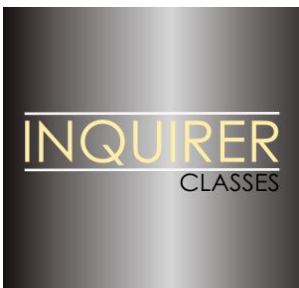
