The Rev. Teri Daily's Letter

From the archives (originally published in the August 2012 Peter's Pence)...

Dear St. Peter's Church Family,

As I get older, one of the things I value most is the rhythm of life—the cycle of time that brings with it the unexpected packed inside the expected. Going back to school has always been one of those events that holds within it both the expected and the unexpected. The expected: school supplies, early mornings, being with friends we've made in previous years, hard work, a feeling of accomplishment. And the unexpected: new friends we'll meet for the first time, moments that open up whole new worlds of knowledge we never knew existed, both successes and failures that for now are not yet part of our story.

The truth is that we approach the ordinariness of each day not knowing what unexpected gifts lie waiting to be discovered. We don't know what plan God has for us, in what stranger we will meet Christ, or what tasks will demand our best efforts. It's like a gift waiting to be unwrapped and examined. As Henri Nouwen once wrote, it's as if God is saying, "I have a present for you, and I can't wait for you to see it."

As we get back into the swing of things at St. Peter's, into our fall routine, I hope that you will look for the unexpected in the familiar. Even if you've been coming to St. Peter's for years, consider being a part of ministry that's new to you. Take time to get to know that person who sits on the other end of your pew each and every Sunday. Greet a newcomer. Visit another service. Sit in the silence of the morning before a service. Sign up for one of our total ministry team that includes ushers, oblationers, greeters, lectors, and coffee hosts. Consider helping with Christian Ed—especially with our children, who are not the "church of tomorrow" but the "church of today." ***Expect to find unexpected gifts in our life together at St. Peter's!***

Several have asked what Brotherhood of St. Andrew meeting agendas entail. The meetings are divided into three parts that correspond to the three disciplines of the Brotherhood: *prayer*, *study*, and *service*. During the prayer sections, prayers of concern are said for individuals in our Church family and personal life who are in need of comfort. At this time we also discuss a message from a book, 5-Minute Bible Workouts for Men.

During the study part of the meeting, a book entitled "Men to the Bible" is used. Two men from scripture are selected to discuss. The service part of the meeting consists of developing plans for projects the Brotherhood will be undertaking. Currently the Brotherhood conducts morning prayer on Tuesday and Thursday mornings. This fall the Brotherhood will be coordinating a St. Peter's Lecture Series.

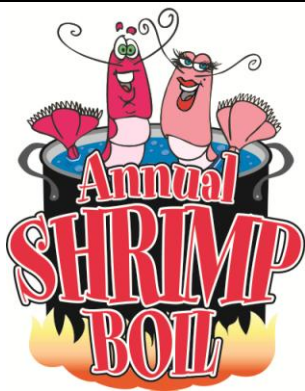
Visitors to the meeting are always welcome.

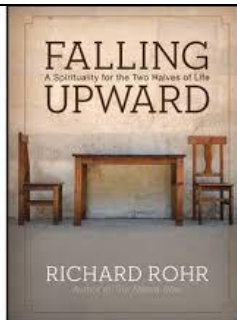

Acolytes Needed!!!

In ancient (and not-so-ancient) times, candles were needed during worship to provide light for reading. Processional torches allowed such light to be carried during the procession for the proclamation of the gospel, after which time the torches were often placed adjacent to the altar or the lectern. We don't need processional torches now in order to read the gospel, but light is still a powerful symbol. In scripture we find light used to symbolize the presence of God, truth, life, and understanding. In keeping with our tradition and the importance of symbols that seep into our consciousness, torches (as well as the cross) continue to play a significant role in our processions during worship.

Vestry Summary

St. Peter's Episcopal Church Vestry Summary June 27, 2016

Attendees: John Phillips, Sam Buchanan, Liz Larson, Dan Allen, Jay Ruud, Jane Harris, Christy Jones, Karen McNutt, Teri Daily, John Churchwell

Opening Prayer: The Reverend Teri Daily

Approval of Minutes from May Meeting: Motion by Dan Allen, seconded by Karen McNutt, all approved.

Visitor Presentation – Marilyn Rishkofski: Marilyn shared a proposal for the installation of picture rail and hangers in the Parish Hall. There are 7 spaces for the picture rail in the Parish Hall. The hangers will hold up to 100 pounds and are moveable both vertically and horizontally. This option should eliminate the need use nails/hangers driven into the plaster. The total estimate for materials only was \$522.00. St. Peter's will be responsible for the installation. The Vestry agreed to move forward with this recommendation.

Episcopal Church Women Update – Marilyn Rishkofski & Teri Daily: There is a grass roots effort at St. Peter's to start a diverse offering of ECW groups.

ArtsFest – Marilyn Rishkofski & Teri Daily: St. Peter's will be participating in Arts Fest this year by hosting an event on September 25th and September 29th. More details to follow.

Committee and Ministry Reports:

- 1. Finance Committee – Jane Harris:** Jane gave a high level overview from the June Finance Committee meeting. Donations are on pace and we're doing well with the current budget.
- 2. Food Pantry – Christy Jones:** The rummage sale raised \$1,700. Jerusalem and the youth group have done a wonderful job with the 3rd Saturday breakfast. It has been well attended. We have the best youth group ever! 10Box can no longer partner with us in the same manner that the Price Cutter. Christie spoke with the manager about our long term relationship and he wasn't supportive. She had a good conversation with the staff at the Walmart Neighborhood Market. They are willing to help us. Christie and team are trying to get a majority of the staples from the Food Bank. The pantry continues to see 160-180 families per month. The need is still there.
- 3. Syrian Refugee Task Force – Teri Daily:** The Task Force met with a group of community leaders in June to discuss providing support to an orphanage in Syria. More to come.

Rector's Report – Teri Daily

- 1. Summer School:** Teri passed along her thanks for the opportunity to attend two classes this summer. They were very helpful.
- 2. Interfaith Work:** Jay McDaniel and Teri are continuing to work on the development of an interfaith network – "Widening the Circle".
