Dear St. Peter's,

The story of Christ's birth is a story of promise, hope, and a revolutionary love. Advent is meant to be a time when we wait and anticipate the change that this brings to our lives. So, what happened? What was once a time to reflect on the coming birth of a savior has somehow turned into a season of stress, traffic jams, and shopping lists.

And when it's all over, many of us are left with presents to return, looming debt that will take months to pay off, and this empty feeling of missed purpose. Is this what we really want out of Advent? Out of Christmas? What if Advent became a time that once again leads to a world-changing event? We believe that it can. If we work together.

Welcome to Advent Conspiracy. The concept behind Advent Conspiracy is simple:

[Worship Fully]

"It starts with Jesus. It ends with Jesus. This is the holistic approach God had in mind for Christmas. It's a season where we are called to put down our burdens and lift a song up to our God. It's a season where love wins, peace reigns, and a king is celebrated with each breath." (From www.adventconspiracy.org. Check it out!) Entering the season of advent with the intent to worship fully, means entering into the season with the mindset that all we do is an act of worship – whether it is giving up good parking spaces for those who might need them more, cooking dinner for our family, offering our best selves at work, or raking the leaves for a neighbor.

[Spend Less]

Before you think we're getting all Scrooge on you, let us explain what we mean. We like gifts. Our kids really like gifts. But consider this: America spends an average of \$450 billion a year every Christmas. How often have you spent money on Christmas presents for no other reason than obligation? How many times have you received a gift out of that same obligation? Thanks, but no thanks, right? We're asking people to consider buying at least ONE LESS GIFT this Christmas. Just one. Sounds insignificant, yet many who have taken this small sacrifice have experienced something nothing less than a miracle: They have been more available to celebrate Christ during the advent season. And what about the money we save when we spend less? Well, what if we told you that together we could change the lives of an entire community if we all just bought one less gift?

[Give More]

God's gift to us was a relationship built on love. So it's no wonder why we're drawn to the idea that Christmas should be a time to love our friends and family in the most memorable ways possible. Time is the real gift Christmas offers us, and no matter how hard we look, it can't be found at the mall. Time to make a gift that turns into the next family heirloom. Time to write mom a letter. Time to take the kids sledding. Time to bake really good cookies and sing really bad Christmas carols. Time to make love visible through relational giving. Sounds a lot better than getting a sweater two sizes too big, right?

[Love All]

When Jesus loved, He loved in ways never imagined. Though rich, he became poor to love the poor, the forgotten, the overlooked and the sick. He played to the margins. By spending less at Christmas we have the opportunity to join Him in giving resources to those who need help the most. When Advent Conspiracy first began four churches challenged this simple concept to its congregations. The result raised more than a half million dollars to aid those in need. One less gift. One unbelievable present in the name of Christ. And we believe that we can do this as well.

So, dear St. Peter's family, are you ready to make a difference? Join us Wednesday evenings at 5:30 pm and Sunday mornings to turn Advent upside down, and to find the real meaning of Christmas hidden underneath.

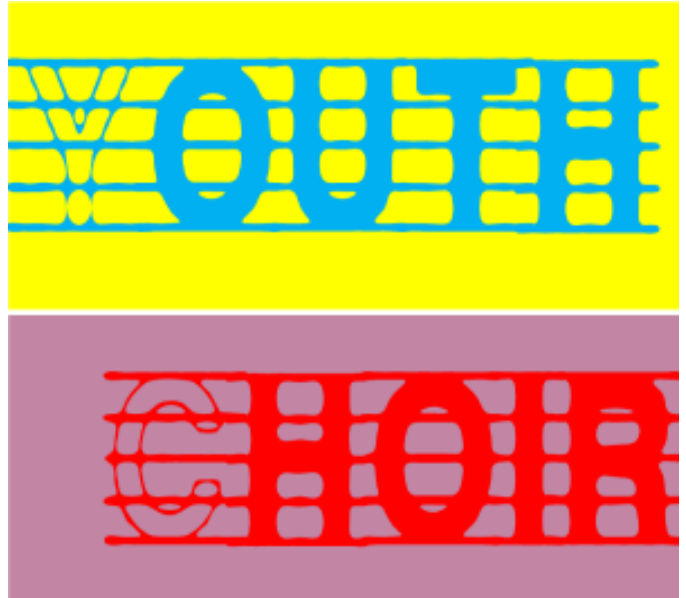
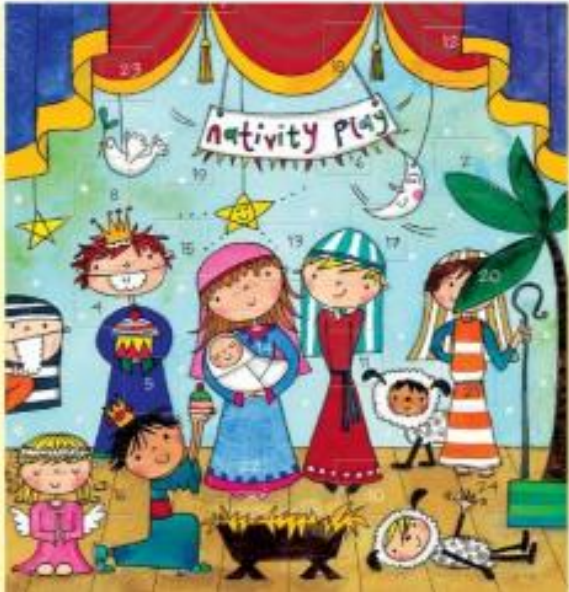
