Rev. Teri Daily's Letter

December 2015

Dear St. Peter's,

Welcome to Advent—a time of transition, a time of waiting. We wait for the Christ child to be born, for the kingdom of heaven to come in all its fullness, and for 2016 to appear on our calendar. We wait for Christmas concerts, relatives to come, and the day when all the presents will be opened and the desserts consumed.

Advent is about being in this moment of transition, even in a world that wants fast answers and quick resolutions. It's about feeling both the uncomfortable feelings *and* the hope that “in-between” times can bring.

This particular Advent also brings with it another kind of transition for St. Peter's. Merry Helen Hedges will be retiring as our deacon. There are no words that can capture what her ministry and presence has meant to us—how her wisdom, her gentleness of spirit, her passion for servant leadership, and her centeredness have helped shape this place and our life together. It is with this assurance that we trust the Holy Spirit's continuing work in both Merry Helen's life and that of St. Peter's.

8:45 am - How Jesus Became God (Library)

The Class will study How Jesus Became God consisting of 24 video lectures by Bart Ehrman, Distinguished Professor of New Testament at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, followed by discussion. "The entire story of how Jesus became God is of paramount importance to everyone with the slightest interest in religion or history. If Jesus had not been declared God at his resurrection, his followers would have remained a small sect within Judaism whose leader ended up on the wrong side of the law & was crucified for his efforts. The massive conversion of Gentiles to belief in Christ would have never happened. Centuries

later, the Roman emperor would never have been converted. The Roman Empire would have never adopted Christian beliefs and ways. The Middle Ages, the Renaissance, the Reformation, and modernity as we know it would have never transpired. And most of us would still be pagan. It is for this reason that there are indeed few questions in the entire history of civilization as important as this one. How did Jesus become God?"

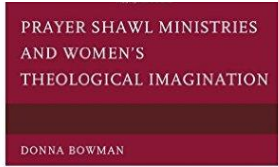
Nativity Pageant Dress Rehearsal - Tuesday 22, at 3:00-5:00 PM

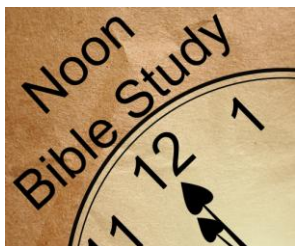

Approval of Minutes from Last Two Meetings: Warren made a motion to approve the minutes, Kelley seconded.

Committee and Ministry Reports

- **Children, Youth and Family Ministries – Jerusalem Greer**
 1. EYC is going great! Meeting Wednesday evenings from 5:00 – 7:00 – has had an average of 25 kids in attendance. 22 kids and 6 adults visited the Faulkner County Fair. Average attendance at Family Formation has been between 10-15 kids. Confirmation classes start Monday, 10/5.
 2. Liz Larson asked about the possibility of forming a Breakfast Club targeting the older kids as a way to keep them engaged.
- **College Ministry – Teri Daily**
 1. Teri passed along thanks to Dan Allen for helping with the 8:00 pm College Ministry on

Wednesday nights. They have had some great programs this year. Jay McDaniel presented last week, and next week the program will be on meditation. The students are interested in doing an urban pilgrimage. Teri will check on that for them. The make-up this year seems to be ½ UCA Students and ½ Hendrix Students.

- **Jr. Warden's Report – Karen McNutt**

1. Repair of the Playground and Fence around it was discussed. The #1 holdup right now is a lack of available funds to cover the repairs.
2. Sign Repair – Teri and Jeanetta asked Cureden Sign to prepare an estimate to freshen the large sign on the corner of Prince & Mitchell and the smaller sign at Cross Street and Mitchell. Karen will meet with Conway Sign and ask and present a second estimate before we move forward with the work. Funds for this will be taken from Advertising budget.
3. Karen will prepare a master list of needed repairs and estimated costs to present to the finance committee.

- **Senior Warden's Report – Sylvia Walker**

1. Pam Neuhofer and Sylvia are continuing to work on the organizing and consolidating of all of the Church files. Sylvia is checking on different options for having the unnecessary files shredded.

- **Rector's Report – Teri Dailey**

1. Credit Line Renewed – The Credit line has been renewed at 3.9%
2. Iona Interns – Linda Brown and Bob Brown
 - i. Linda Brown will be vesting twice a month at St. Peters. She will preach once this semester and twice next semester.
 - ii. Bob Brown will be vesting twice a month at St. Peters. He will preach once this semester and three times next semester.
3. Blessing of a Marriage – October 18th – John Phillips and Steve Eddy. Will be held at the 11:00 am service with a reception to follow.
4. Bishop's Visit October 25th – Large group of confirmations and receptions, along with 2 baptisms. A group from 1st United Methodist will be visiting. We're expecting a large group and will need 4 experienced Ushers for the 11:00 service.

- **Review of the Finance Committee Report – Warren Readnour & Teri Daily**

1. Pledges are \$19K behind what we have budgeted. Anticipating a shortfall again at the end of October.
2. The good news – we've received 91% of Catch the Vision pledges. Wonderful participation.
3. Warren made a motion that the Vestry remove the \$87,000 line item from the Operating budget that has been pending for some time. This line item makes it appear that the amount will need to be repaid to another area of the budget which isn't the case. Jay Ruud 2nd the motion. Motion passed.
