Dear St. Peter's,

This Christmas the Bowman-Murray family – Noel, Donna, Archer, and Cady Gray – have been embroiled in a board game marathon. The scores have been carefully compiled; Archer has even illustrated their rankings in graph form. A little intra-family competition can be healthy, I think. At some point during the holiday season, though, it became clear that playing only until someone reached 1,000 points practically ensured Donna's last place finish – the goal needed to be extended if there was to be any chance that she might catch up. And so the finish line was stretched to 3,000 points. Even so, when I asked if next year's holiday season would see a continuation of this year's scores or if everyone's score would start back at zero, the answer was that the game would start fresh, with everyone on equal ground. Perhaps this is Donna's only hope for success, and maybe it's good for the whole family.

Ancient Israel understood this importance of starting over. The concept of Jubilee embodies the need to periodically level the playing field, to occasionally start back at zero, or at least to begin from a place of more equal footing. We read in the book of Leviticus: "You shall hallow the fiftieth year and you shall proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you: you shall return, every one of you, to your property and every one of you to your family" (Leviticus 25:10). If an Israelite had sold the family homestead to pay an otherwise insurmountable debt, Jubilee saw a return of the land to its former inhabitant. Jubilee was a sign of grace. It was an offer to start over, the chance for a "do-over" of sorts.

I suspect, though, that Jubilee taught another lesson as well. For those who would have been expected to relinquish acquired lands and other possessions, Jubilee was a reminder of impermanence; it was a reminder that nothing is absolutely ours to own. As the year of Jubilee approached, grips would have inevitably needed to loosen in preparation. There is grace here, too; for if we live with clenched fists, our hands are not open to receive. These two sides of Jubilee – impermanence and new possibilities, loss and gift – are actually two sides of the same coin.

It's not clear if Israel really ever practiced Jubilee, and we certainly don't have its concepts embedded in our laws today. But time is, in its own right, a perpetual Jubilee. For those of us who have lost loved ones in 2014, the New Year brings with it a sense that they are receding even further into the past, in some ways deepening the feeling of loss. For those of us who have experienced failures that come in a variety of packages, the New Year closes the books on 2014, and in the process our failures are seemingly cemented in history. And yet 2015 offers a new starting line, another trip around the sun, the gift of new opportunities, the chance to respond to challenges in constructive and compassionate ways, the promise of healing, and the grace of a million second chances. Time may be a mixed blessing, but its overall trajectory is most definitely life-giving, if only we can live with open hands – free to experience and practice the grace of Jubilee.

My wish is that each and every day of 2015 be a day of Jubilee. May we find deep peace in the midst of loss, hope in the promises of new beginnings, and companions with whom to share both.

At the Annual Meeting in January we'll be electing new vestry members. If you would like to nominate yourself or someone else (please ask that person first) for a position on the Vestry, please notify Jeanetta Darley in the church office. To serve on the Vestry, one must be a confirmed member of St. Peter's, be 18 years of age or older, be a frequent attendant of worship services for the preceding six months, and be a regular contributor of record. Nominations must be received by January 7, 2015.

The vestry of a church has three main responsibilities. The first two are managerial: to take care of the finances of the parish and to take care of our buildings and facilities. The third responsibility is that of filling various representative and leadership positions, such as choosing delegates for diocesan convention, selecting those to fill positions stipulated by the canons (treasurer, junior warden, and secretary), and in the case of a parish selecting a rector. But the importance of the vestry to the life of our congregation doesn't end there. The vestry also takes an active role in discerning our vision for ministry here at St. Peter's.

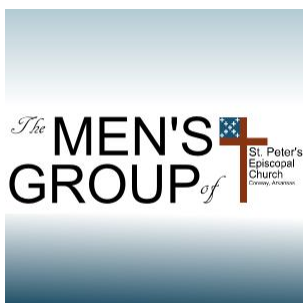

Vestry Summary

November 2, 2014

Opening Prayer: Teri Daily

Approval of minutes from last meeting: See attached handouts. Approved with changes made to Vestry Retreat minutes; Vestry Meeting minutes approved. Both moved, seconded and all approved.

Committee and Ministry Reports

Finance Committee: John Shute. (See attached handouts) No unforeseen surprises. In looking at the Profit and Loss, we are down @ \$13K in pledges, which explains our end of October money crunch. Two things at play here: we adopted a deficit budget and pledge payments aren't current to date. (Also, unpledged giving is less than it was last year at this time.)

Personnel expenses are running a little below budget. Diocesan Commitment is a little over budget because of the catch up for 2013 that we did at the beginning of 2014 to make up our 10% giving amount.

End of October operations shortfall: \$15K was moved from CTV staff development funds to cover payroll. These are funds that had been budgeted for 2014, just not used to date.

2013 Audit Review: Kitson will send the audit findings out to the vestry for discussion at our next meeting.

Warren made a motion to accept the financials as presented. Seconded and all approved.

Technology Guru/Ministry: LeRoy Hendricks. LeRoy gave a brief history of the church's 20 year old server, and how it is now outdated and obsolete. Connecting Point gave us a proposal for new server installation and support (see attached handout), coming in @ \$5000.00. New operational software will have to be purchased as well, bringing the total up to @ \$5500.00. Sylvia asked how long the quote is good for, and Warren would like more information before a decision is made. A second proposal from another company has been requested.

Youth, Children and Family Ministry: Jerusalem Greer. Trunk or Treat was this past Wednesday the 29th. Lots of participation! Hot dogs sold out! Approximately \$200 was raised for Camp Mitchell scholarships next year. Different ministries were involved as well: DOK, Men's Group, the Food Pantry, the Writing Group.

Socktober was a success: over 200 pairs of socks were donated.

The youth are gearing up for Turkey Day, and bagging up a ton of rice.

St. Peter's had 5 kids go to AYE this fall.

Family Formation is going well, and has become a pre-K through 6th grade class for the most part. Understanding the liturgical calendar and liturgical year is one of the things they have been working on in class.

A Youth Sunday school class is being discussed for the older kids: 7th through 12th grades. This class would be mostly discussion. At this point, Jerusalem is looking for someone else in the congregation to lead this class. Some parents have also approached Jerusalem about a Parents of Teens support group possibility as well. Estimated time for kick off is mid-January.

A youth choir will also be starting, and will be run by Emily Madden. The group will sing at the family service on Christmas Eve, and if it goes well, it may be continued into next year.

Karen Collins will be doing the Christmas Pageant again this year.

Old/Continuing Business Items

Courtyard Update: Warren Readnour and Carolyn Scott. Doug Knight and our college students cleared out all the old bricks that were in the courtyard. Last week, the Bishop dedicated the new labyrinth. After another visit from the consultant, aesthetics were discussed about seeing the courtyard from different parts of the church. Dale Walker has offered to affix the labyrinth plaque.

Stewardship: Warren Readnour. This coming Sunday the 9th is Celebration Sunday. Kitson is to be sending out thank you letters for those folks who have turned in pledge cards.

Thanksgiving Baskets: Tuesday the 25th is Turkey Day. Donations are on target and all is a go! Nothing new to report.

New Business

Digital Church Directory: Teri Daily. Leigh Ann Warriner is interesting in heading up and organizing an online digital church directory. Software for this will run @ \$100.00

Storage Room: Sylvia Walker. The storage room is filling up with miscellaneous stuff. Sylvia discussed a project to clean-up the room and install shelving.

Rector's Report: Teri Daily

Bishop's Visit: The annual visit went well. We received/confirmed ten people. Teri and Jerusalem will be taking youth confirmands to the synagogue.

Visit from Episcopal Relief and Development Representative on 10/31/14: During the visit, our involvement in the recent disaster response was discussed.

Linda Brown: Linda is the senior warden at Trinity Cathedral. We are her mentor congregation, as she is in the diaconate program at the Iona School. She will be here one Sunday a month to observe.

Landscaping Contract: (see attached handout from Newton Guenard) Norma Smothers will be consulting with Newt about grounds care.
