# Rev. Teri Daily's Letter



July 2016

Dear St. Peter's,

On July 22<sup>nd</sup> we will celebrate the Feast of Mary Magdalene. Beginning in the sixth century, Mary Magdalene was subjected to a rewriting of history, one that made her into a penitent prostitute. Thankfully, through a return to biblical texts and the exploration of extracanonical sources, the Church is once again seeing in her a faithful disciple of Jesus. Mary Magdalene is mentioned by name in the gospels of John, Mark, and Matthew as one who was present at the crucifixion. She is, it can be assumed, included in Luke's report that "all [Jesus'] acquaintances, including the women who followed him from Galilee, stood at a distance, watching these things" (Luke 23:49). In all four gospels Mary Magdalene is among the women who go to the tomb to care for Jesus' body and, according to the gospel of John, she weeps in distress once she arrives.

Perhaps it is Mary Magdalene's willingness to bear witness to suffering that draws me to her – her capacity to watch Jesus' death (whether from beneath the cross or from a distance), her intention to touch his broken body with reverence. To do so takes a strength more fierce than that required to lift a five-hundred pound weight, and more enduring than that necessary to win the Tour de France. This may be why we never make the desperately needed changes to end mass shootings in this country. We cannot bear the pain that comes with facing the death of innocent children, of our LGBT neighbors, of everyday people like us. Because this pain is so hard to bear, our attention fades to the next "newsworthy" event within mere days of a tragedy.

But this is what we learn from Mary Magdalene: Only if we are able to bear witness to suffering will we also bear witness to resurrection. After all, Mary Magdalene was the first to bear witness to the empty tomb; in the gospel of John, she was the also the first to see the risen Christ and the first to be given the task of proclaiming the good news. Mary Magdalene's report to the disciples: "I have seen the Lord" (John 20:18).

The past few weeks have given us much suffering to which we can bear witness – the Orlando shooting and the terrorist attack in Turkey are just two such events. And, of course, there is suffering every day in our world in a myriad of forms – the child diagnosed with cancer, the couple who decides divorce is the only way forward, the person who can't find work, the refugee without a place to call home.

What does it look like for us, like Mary Magdalene, to bear witness to such suffering in our world? Where do we find the strength to tend broken bodies, and the endurance to change systems and attitudes and hearts (beginning with our own)? Surely, the action we are called to take will be different for each of us. But what will be the same is this: If we stand with those who suffer, we (like Mary Magdalene) will see Jesus. For if scripture tells us anything, it tells us that these are Jesus' friends.

### Brotherhood of St. Andrew

How great would it be if YOU were part of a group of men at St. Peter's which meets the third Monday of each month to pray together, discuss the meaning of scriptures in our daily lives, and reach out to serve others through service in His name. Several have asked what Brotherhood of St. Andrew meeting agendas entail. The meetings are divided into three parts that correspond to the three disciplines of the Brotherhood: *prayer*, *study*, and *service*. During the prayer sections, prayers of concern are said for individuals in our Church family and personal life who are in need of comfort. 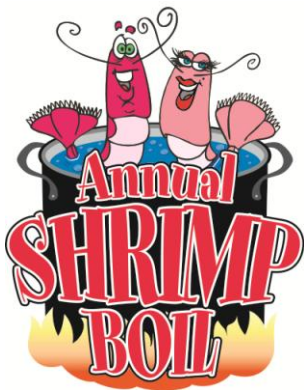

### Acolytes Needed!!!

In ancient (and not-so-ancient) times, candles were needed during worship to provide light for reading. Processional torches allowed such light to be carried during the procession for the proclamation of the gospel, after which time the torches were often placed adjacent to the altar or the lectern. We don't need processional torches now in order to read the gospel, but light is still a powerful symbol. In scripture we find light used to symbolize the presence of God, truth, life, and understanding. In keeping with our tradition and the importance of symbols that seep into our consciousness, torches (as well as the cross) continue to play a significant role in our processions during worship.

Vestry Meeting Minutes  
May 22, 2016

**Opening prayer:** The Reverend Teri Daily

**Welcome John Churchwell to our staff!** Teri officially introduced John to the vestry, described his background experience and remarked on what a fabulous job he has been doing for our church.

**Approval of minutes from April 24<sup>th</sup> vestry meeting:**

Two corrections were identified (the misspelling of Sam Buchanan's name and omission of vestry counters from May 22<sup>nd</sup>). A motion was made to accept minutes with corrections by Dan Allen, second by John Phillips.

**Presentation:** Ideas for renovation of the Parish Hall were presented by Teri Daily and Karen McNutt. Marilyn Rishkofsky may be able to help us put in place a permanent picture rail that can be used for Art, Pray, Love. The rest of the renovation for the Parish Hall would include painting the Parish Hall, cleaning out the foyer area, purchasing new chairs, and the addition of cabinets/cupboards in the foyer. The cost of the paint has already been donated, and Karen hopes to find volunteers to paint the Parish Hall. There was discussion regarding possible funds to be used in the Parish Hall renovation. The Parish Hall renovation will hopefully be completed this summer.

## **Committee and Ministry reports:**

- Finance Committee - John Shute presented the Statement of Financial Position as well as the Profit & Loss statement, and provided Finance Committee minutes from April. A motion to accept these reports was made by Jay Ruud and second by Jerry Adams.
- Children, Youth and Family Ministries - Jerusalem Greer reported that the EYC had their last meeting for the semester at the bowling alley. Family Formation meetings are also finished. There will be a Newcomers Brunch at the Morgan House at 10 a.m. on June 5th. There will also be a belonging ceremony on June 5th to recognize those who recently have joined St Peter's Episcopal Church.  
St. Peter's Church will host a hospitality tent for the Pride Parade on June 5<sup>th</sup>. There are several members working on this team to provide a tent for shelter from sun and bottled water. Members from St Peter's will carry a banner reading "This is my Family, this is my Home."
- Food Pantry - Christy Jones. Jerusalem Greer reported for Christy that approximately 30 Food Pantry clients were served at the first community breakfast. This breakfast was without any advertisement, but served to those who came to the food pantry that Saturday. Flyers will be placed in the food pantry clients' bags each Saturday, to advertise for the next community breakfast which will be on June 18th. The youth organized, served and cooked the breakfast for the food pantry clients. The rummage sale was a great success. Christy will report later on the total money raised for the Food Pantry.
- Syrian Refugee Task Force - Teri Daily. There will be a Community Dialog on June 1<sup>st</sup> for the community's response to the Syrian Refugee crisis. Plans are being made to directly assist refugees in Syria.

**Junior Warden's Report** - Karen McNutt offered a warm welcome to our new parish administrator, John Churchwell, who has already done wonderful things for our church office and staff, as well as for members of our parish.

## **Rector's Report** - Teri Daily

1. Peggy Cromwell's contract: Teri described Peggy's duties and her schedule at St Peter's as our new deacon, as well as passed out copies of the contract between St. Peter's and Peggy.
2. Application for Ordination to Priesthood: Hannah Hooker. This document was signed by all members of the vestry.
3. Application for Candidacy: John Musser. This document was signed by all members of the vestry.
4. Teri's coverage for Sewanee: Hap Hoffman will cover for Teri on 6/12 and 6/19.
5. Interfaith work: Teri Daily and Jay McDaniel are building an interfaith coalition in Conway.
6. Columbarium - Difficulty with drainage continues to be an issue. Families have voiced their concern to Teri about the sites being under water during heavy rain. It is possible that memorial gifts may be used to fund this project. A meeting for the memorial gifts committee will be called to discuss this issue.
7. Alcohol Policy - The policy has been reviewed by a lawyer, and is good to use.
8. Father's Day Celebration - the women of the vestry will host on June 19<sup>th</sup>.
9. Artsfest - Marilyn Rishofsky is heading up plans for this event in late September. St. Peter's plans on hosting organist Tim Allen and soprano Christine Westoff for a Sunday afternoon concert. We also hope to hold a Coffee House event on a Thursday evening.
