Rev. Teri Daily's Letter

May 2015

Dear St. Peter's,

The month of May blossoms with all the new beginnings of spring – colorful flowers dot the roadsides, the brown carpet of our lawns become bright green, and there's excitement as we look forward to the vacations and school breaks that summer brings. But May is also a time full of endings – final school concerts, final exams, graduations, and preparations for moving. This time of year is a transition, a letting go and a reaching out toward something new. The two necessarily go together; we inevitably find ourselves always in the middle, hands open both behind and in front of us.

I think it's fitting that we always enter the month of May while we're in the season of Easter. It's a season that honors this time in our lives, both the deaths and the resurrections. I think we need to pay attention to both, to the feelings each one brings us. Let's be honest: change can feel like a death in some way. It can be frightening, full of uncertainty, and riddled with nostalgia. We can see what we're leaving behind, but the path in front of us isn't so crystal clear. Often we experience the ambivalence the women must have felt standing before the empty tomb – loss mixed with expectation.

Actually, every moment of our life is lived in this mixture. Time is, in fact, always a letting go and a reaching towards that next moment which always comes to us a gift. Every minute is inherently a practice of faith, a prayer to the God who holds all our beginnings and all our ends in God's hand.

As we begin our journey through May, I offer below some prayers and thoughts on transitions in our lives.

8:45 am - How Jesus Became God (Library)

The Class will study How Jesus Became God consisting of 24 video lectures by Bart Ehrman, Distinguished Professor of New Testament at The University of No. Carolina at Chapel Hill, followed by discussion. "The entire story of how Jesus became God is of paramount importance to everyone with the slightest interest in religion or history. If Jesus had not been declared God at his resurrection, his followers would have remained a small sect within Judaism whose leader ended up on the wrong side of the law & was crucified for his efforts. The massive conversion of Gentiles to belief in Christ would have never happened. Centuries

later, the Roman emperor would never have been converted. The Roman Empire would have never adopted Christian beliefs and ways. The Middle Ages, the Renaissance, the Reformation, and modernity as we know it would have never transpired. And most of us would still be pagan. It is for this reason that there are indeed few questions in the entire history of civilization as important as this one. How did Jesus become God?"

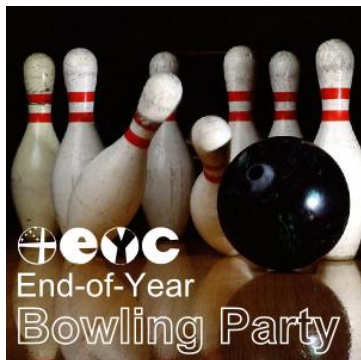
10 am Family Formation (Parish Hall)

Minutes from Last Meeting: Kelley made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded and all approved.

Committee and Ministry Reports:

1. **Financial Committee:** Kitson Roger. Financial reports were presented. The financial shortfall for month end was discussed, as was continuing to keep the congregation in the loop. Kitson will be processing payroll tomorrow.

Paypal update: The church now has an account with Paypal. Kitson and Jerusalem are in the process of setting up the church website for online giving.
