THE REV. TERI DAILY'S LETTER

November 2016

*Gratitude bestows reverence, allowing us to encounter everyday epiphanies,
those transcendent moments of awe that change forever how we experience life
and the world.*

--John Milton

Thanksgiving is nearly upon us. Schedules and menus and travels are already taking shape. But do we really feel more grateful this time of year?

A life of gratitude brings with it a multitude of benefits -- improved sleep quality, greater self-esteem, fewer aches and pains, greater empathy, and a reduction in the symptoms of depression (just to name a few). So, how does one become more thankful?

Richard Rohr has written: "We do not think ourselves into new ways of living, we live ourselves into new ways of thinking." In other words, we become grateful by taking part in specific practices of gratitude. Such practices can range from writing a thank-you letter, to enjoying nature, to celebrating birthdays and anniversaries, to thanking people throughout the day for their service, to decreasing the number of times we complain each day. One of the most popular ways to practice gratitude is by keeping a gratitude journal -- writing down several things each for which one is thankful. (There are even gratitude apps so it can be done on one's phone!)

In her book *One Thousand Gifts*, Ann Voskamp made her gratitude journal into a self-dare: Could she write down one thousand things for which she was grateful, things as small as the way light shines on the bedroom floor and as large as a successful surgery? This list was an exercise in recognizing the many gifts of God that come to us throughout the day, gifts of which we are (in large part) unaware. It was a prayer of thanksgiving in list-form. But somewhere along the way, she realized that this list of gratitude was actually something much deeper; it was a list of the many ways that God loves her. She describes her epiphany this way:

The list is God's list, the pulse of His love - the love that thrums on the other side of our prayers. And I see it now for what this



really is, this dare to write down one thousand things I love. It really is a dare to name all the ways that God loves me. The true Love Dare. To move into His presence and listen to His love unending and know the grace uncontainable. ... Cheese. Sun. Journal. Naming. Love. Here. It all feels startlingly hallowed, and I breathe shallow. I should take the shoes off.[1]

Gratitude. Is it our love for God, or God's love for us, or a dance of love that sweeps us up into the very life of God? I think the last -- God's dance in which we, in our most grateful of moments, are swept up as a partner.

So this Thanksgiving season enter the dance of love. Practice gratitude each day. Learn to see epiphanies everywhere. And then take off your shoes, for you will recognize that the ground on which you stand is holy.

A General Thanksgiving

Accept, O Lord, our thanks and praise for all that you have done for us. We thank you for the splendor of the whole creation, for the beauty of this world, for the wonder of life, and for the mystery of love.

We thank you for the blessing of family and friends, and for the loving care which surrounds us on every side.

We thank you for setting us at tasks which demand our best efforts, and for leading us to accomplishments which satisfy and delight us.

We thank you also for those disappointments and failures that lead us to acknowledge our dependence on you alone.

Above all, we thank you for your Son Jesus Christ; for the truth of his Word and the example of his life; for his steadfast obedience, by which he overcame temptation; for his dying, through which he overcame death; and for his rising to life again, in which we are raised to the life of your kingdom.

Grant us the gift of your Spirit, that we may know him and make him known; and through him, at all times and in all places, may give thanks to you in all things. Amen. (page 836)

JERUSALEM'S NOTE

November is a month we spend focusing on gratitude as a country, and stewardship as a church. Which actually makes sense because the two things - a thankful heart and the spiritual practice of intentional giving - really do belong together. A thankful heart is a heart that will fuel our wills and motivate our actions to give back - to respond in love to the one who loves us most of all, God our creator.

But what do we do with all this love and thankfulness? How can we move it beyond words? This is the spiritual practice of Stewardship - it is the practice of putting the love and gratitude that we feel in our souls, into tangible actions that have lasting impact on our material world - at home, at church, in our community, in the world. We give intentionally, both through financial gifts and service actions, we are living out our thankfulness, we are celebrating through our outward and visible actions, the inward spiritual graces of love and generosity that we receive through Christ

This month every member of St. Peter's will receive a Stewardship Pledge Card. This is an annual practice that helps our Vestry set a budget for the upcoming year. This year as part of Stewardship season I will also be handing out kid-friendly pledge cards, and talking to the children and youth about what it means to be an intentional steward of our church and creation. We will be talking about what it means to give with a grateful heart, what it means to give-back, why churches need giving, and how important love is to all our giving.

Here are a few easy activities to help your family celebrate this season of thankfulness and giving at home:

1. Help your kids fill out their Stewardship Cards, or perhaps even fill out your Household Stewardship Cards together, then place them in an offering plate on Sunday morning.

VESTRY MINUTES

St. Peter's Episcopal Church

Vestry Summary

October 2, 2016

Members present: Teri Daily, Jerusalem Greer, Jane Harris, Karen McNutt, Jay Ruud, Liz Larsen, Jerry Adams, Dan Allen, John Phillips, Christy Garrett-Jones, Sam Buchanan, Mike King, John Shute, Kelley King

Opening prayer, led by The Reverend Teri Daily.

Visitor presentation: Danny Schieffler and Anne Chenoweth from the University of the South School of Theology introduced their Capital Campaign for the School of Theology. The funds raised will benefit building renovation, a move closer to the middle of campus, scholarships and faculty support. Their goal is to raise 28 million dollars, and they have raised 17 million, so far. They provided us with brochures about their capital campaign, and requested that St Peter's consider making a donation/gift.

A motion was made by Jerry Adams to accept the minutes from the last vestry meeting, with a correction of the spelling of Mouaz. Second by Dan Allen.

The committee and ministry reports:

1. Finance Committee report was given by John Shute and Mike King. It was noted that the Capital Campaign funds that we already have in hand will last until mid-November. A motion was made by Jerry Adams to accept the report, second by Dan Allen.
2. Food Pantry and TG Baskets - Christy Garrett-Jones reported that we will provide 150 Thanksgiving dinners this year. Approximately 130 of those baskets will go to our Food Pantry clients, and the rest to our parishioners and community members. The Food Pantry actually ran out of food Saturday (yesterday). Christy told us we are getting food for the pantry primarily from the AR Food Bank and Neighborhood Walmart.
3. Children Youth and Families - Jerusalem Greer reported that we have at least 50 kids--10+ preschool-aged, and 10 babies. There are lots of new families with small children as well as visitors bringing children. The EYC went to the AR State Fair as an outing and are having a dog wash to raise money for the Food Pantry; two of our youth are serving on DYE Council. The St. Peter's Coffee House had over 100 attendees.
4. Syrian Refugee Task Force - Jerry Adams reported that St. Peter's and several others in the community have agreed to adopt and orphanage in Syria. There will be a fundraiser at Legends in the near future.
5. College Ministry - Teri Daily reported that Peggy Cromwell is doing a great job. They have had one Canterbury meeting, and next will be going to a compline service at Green Chapel on Hendrix campus.
6. Stewardship - Jerry Adams and Teri Daily described a stewardship campaign that will be implemented this year. The vestry will prepare by reading a book about stewardship called "Defying Gravity." Vestry members will lead the small group discussions, which will start October 30th and continue through the end of November. New members will be invited to participate in this campaign. Pledge cards will go out in November and there will be an in-gathering of the pledge cards in early December.

The Rector's Report -Teri Daily

1. DOK Request -The DOK has withdrawn their request for allocated money in the budget.
2. Columbarium - It has been proposed that the Courtyard be dedicated in memory of Peggy Hays. Chris Odom will be asked to visit and describe the architectural and landscaping plans that were developed for the courtyard. The vestry will further discuss a special campaign for this project at the upcoming vestry meeting.
3. The Vestry Retreat will be a one-day meeting at the Morgan House on Saturday 10/22/16, from 9 am to 3 pm. Vestry members are asked to arrive at 8:30 for breakfast together. The vestry members are asked to read "Leading from Within" by Parker Palmer

prior to the Vestry retreat.

4. The Back-up System - John Churchwell reported that we now have a back-up system for all the computers. Servant Keeper update was installed.

5. Artsfest Follow Up - It was a success! We have applied for a grant from the AR Arts Council for \$600 towards the cost of the events. Teri offered special thanks to Karen and Tom McNutt for having the parish hall painted prior to event.

6- Vestry Nominations for the coming year - The off-going vestry members (Liz Larson, Jay Ruud, Jerry Adams) will make suggestions for people to serve on the vestry.

7. Teri will be out of town October 10th-15th.

Junior Warden's Report-Karen McNutt.

1. Parish Hall - The painting has been done. Karen is still looking for scaffolding so the ceiling may safely be painted.

2. Critter Getters - The raccoons came back for another visit; this time they visited the Circle of Trust meeting. The trees need trimming, more patching of the roof was done, and ceiling tiles were replaced after the last visitation.

3. Windows - The storm windows in Teri's office and the creation window were repaired.

4. Other - The Bishop visits on 10/9/16, and 18 people will be confirmed and or received. There will be a blessing of a marriage at the 11:00 service on October 16th for Chrissie and Melanie Cavender. The Blessing of the Animals will be October 2nd at the 9 o'clock service, out in the Courtyard.

Senior Warden's Report - Jane Harris

ArtsFest was well attended. The coffeehouse was also very well attended, despite a mistake in the advertising of the date. We should be receiving grant money to help offset the cost of the Sunday event.
