
Join in as we honor the Saints who have gone on before us. The mornings celebration will include:



Activities for No Shave November are sponsored by the men of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew.




## Defying Gravity Small Group Book Studies November 6 - November 30 (taking off Thanksgiving week)





## Pantry Musings

I remember one Sunday when some old timers were arguing for us to read the Psalms instead of sing them. That Sunday we had had a particularly obscure Psalm. After several minutes of discussion, someone remarked that the reading of today's Psalm referred to such-and-such and asked if they would have gotten that out of reading it. Needless to say that ended the cry for not singing the Psalms. But there is more, Buechner states "... I discovered that when a prayer or a psalm or a passage of the Gospels is sung, you hear it in a new way. Words wear thin after a while, especially religious words. [p. 83, Telling Secrets] But, he adds, music adds some magic and power to the shop worn words that we are so used to hearing. I am certain that one of my musician friends can explain this better than I am able to. But it occurs to me that to sing something requires more of the body, more commitment, different muscles, and more relaxation, than the spoken word. Do you notice a difference in hearing the spoken word and the sung word when you worship? Are there certain scriptures that you know better by singing them than hearing them read? -Ann Drake

### Direct Withdrawals Update

In accordance with a recommendation from our CPA, Ms. Debbie Turner, we will be shifting the dates on which Direct Deposits are made each month. This accounting decision will help our members and St. Peter's Church to clarify year end as well as month to month giving totals.
