Pantry Musings

I'm continuing to think about the priesthood of all believers. Sometimes we think of the ordained priest of the institutional church as having the experiences of the Holy for us, and at times there are priests who encourage us to believe that they do. I've met some of them. Don't be taken in by them or yourselves. The requirement for someone to be a priest is that they (or we) have insight into the everyday parts of our lives. This is painful if we do not like the person severing as our priest in any given moment. Especially if they are perceived as our enemy. Sometimes it may turn out that you are a priest to someone you do not know, or even to an ordained priest. The gift of the insight that makes us a priest, comes from our experience of the Holy. This is a gift from God that enables us to see below the surface of the everyday. A gift that introduces us to what Countryman calls the 'border country' - that place where we transcend the ordinary every day and see the underlying factors beyond the obvious. Here, in this place we understand our limits, our incompleteness, our finitude, our limited abilities, the limits of our languages, our culture, our time in history, our place, our mortality. We recognize the fear and the angst that comes with the realization of these limits and this incompleteness. So the first thing that we realize is our limitations, our mortality. In the border country, we also realize the importance of our connectedness. We are social beings, yes, even the hermit. We all need others to exist in this world. We need to establish relationships with others in order to define ourselves as human beings. These experiences are ongoing in greater or lesser degrees of intensity throughout our lives stretching us out toward God in new and different ways as our lives progress in history. It is here, out of these experiences in the border country that our priesthood is realized.- Ann Drake

Jeremiah 20:7-13

O LORD, you have enticed me,
and I was enticed;
you have overpowered me,
and you have prevailed.

For whenever I speak, I must cry out,
I must shout, "Violence and destruction!"
For the word of the LORD has become for me

then within me there is something like a burning fire
shut up in my bones;
I am weary with holding it in,
and I cannot.
For I hear many whispering:
"Terror is all around!
Denounce him! Let us denounce him!"
All my close friends
are watching for me to stumble.
"Perhaps he can be enticed,
and we can prevail against him,
and take our revenge on him."
But the LORD is with me like a dread warrior;
therefore my persecutors will stumble,
and they will not prevail.
They will be greatly shamed,
for they will not succeed.
Their eternal dishonor
will never be forgotten.
O LORD of hosts, you test the righteous,
you see the heart and the mind;
let me see your retribution upon them,
for to you I have committed my cause.
Sing to the LORD;
praise the LORD!
For he has delivered the life of the needy
from the hands of evildoers.

Psalms 69: 8-11, (12-17), 18-20

8 Surely, for your sake have I suffered reproach, *
and shame has covered my face.
9 I have become a stranger to my own kindred, *
an alien to my mother's children.
10 Zeal for your house has eaten me up; *
the scorn of those who scorn you has fallen upon me.
11 I humbled myself with fasting, *
but that was turned to my reproach.
[12 I put on sack-cloth also, *
and became a byword among them.
13 Those who sit at the gate murmur against me, *
and the drunkards make songs about me.

- 15 "In your great mercy, O God, *
answer me with your unfailing help.
- 16 Save me from the mire; do not let me sink; *
let me be rescued from those who hate me
and out of the deep waters.
- 17 Let not the torrent of waters wash over me,
neither let the deep swallow me up; *
do not let the Pit shut its mouth upon me.]
- 18 Answer me, O LORD, for your love is kind; *
in your great compassion, turn to me.'
- 19 "Hide not your face from your servant; *
be swift and answer me, for I am in distress.
- 20 Draw near to me and redeem me; *
because of my enemies deliver me.

Romans 6:1b-11

Should we continue in sin in order that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin go on living in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.
