### **Education for Ministry (EfM) Information Session, July 23<sup>rd</sup> at 10 am in the Parish Hall**

An information session on the EfM program will be held Sunday, July 23<sup>rd</sup> at 10 in the Parish Hall. Please join us then to learn more about what the EfM training can do for your spiritual learning and growth!

EfM is a four-year course of study that provides lay persons with the tools to move forward in Christian service, gain a deeper understanding of scripture, and acquire a stronger ability to think theologically.

The EfM seminar group, which is the nucleus of the Education for Ministry program, provides the spiritual community in which to study, pray, and reflect. Each seminar group consists of six to twelve participants and a trained mentor who meet weekly over the course of a nine-month academic year. These meetings are usually from two and a half to three hours in length.

### Pantry Musings

Priesthood begins in developing relations with God and our neighbor, whoever that person might be. Knowing God is also found in relationships with others. Each time we embrace an experience of knowing and relating to another we grow in our vulnerability which allows us to release our attempts to control and hold on. There is an enjoyment and a deepening of our spirit. We are able to celebrate the life of the other person, enjoying them for who they are and what they bring to us, for the other in a relationship of this kind is a priest to us as well. There are many kinds of priesthood, not just what Mother Church ordains to serve the sacraments. Most of them are far more significant to us in our daily lives -- for the person who helps with our recovery from an illness, in therapy, or food preparation is of immediate need and may indeed be a priest. The persons who love us and care about us are also priests. A good listener who can be trusted is an invaluable priest. Sometimes we need to seek help from those outside our immediate relationship, do it with permission! Remember that relationships are built on trust. Honor that trust. Being a priest to others requires that we hold the other in sacred relation. We know their value as a person, we trust them just as we expect to be trusted, confidentiality is extremely important. Another's problems are not everyone's problems, nor are ours. -Ann Drake
